HOW TO PREPARE VEGETABLES FOR EXHIBITION

1. Choose medium sized, regular shaped specimens, of nearly the same shape and size as possible.
2. Cut tops off, leaving one inch.
3. Choose specimens that are free from blemish of any kind.
4. Polish with a dry cloth.
5. Potatoes should be washed (polish with a dry cloth).
6. Vegetables should be shown on small foam plates or in a shallow container.

HOW TO PREPARE FLOWERS FOR EXHIBITION

1. Cut stems 6" long if possible.
2. Show in a narrow mouth container (i.e. small bottle, etc.).
3. Add weight to bottom of container (i.e. marbles, stones, etc.).
4. Choose specimens free from blemishes.
5. Choose open blooms.

Note: Sunflowers can be used with cut flowers and not with wildflowers. Cattails can be with wildflowers and not with cut flowers.

4. Pumpkin to be brought to the Fair on Wednesday of Fair Week between 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. for weigh-in. If this year's largest pumpkin is larger than the current record to date of 1147 lbs, the exhibitor will be awarded \$100.00 and bragging rights to have grown the LARGEST PUMPKIN IN NORTHERN ONTARIO.
6. Extra large pumpkins should be on a pallet, please weigh pallet before and mark this weight on the pallet to be able to determine the actual weight of the pumpkin alone.
